TCDC Celebrates our 20th Anniversary: 1991-2011

We are celebrating our 20th year as the *Tioga County Development Corporation*. We have come a long ways since 1991, but it is important to look back and reflect on the creation of the *Tioga County Development Corporation*.

The *Tioga County Development Corporation (TCDC)* was incorporated on May 22, 1991, as a Pennsylvania industrial development corporation. The primary purpose is to foster and promote the overall economic development strategy of Tioga County; to create or assist in the creation of new employment and business opportunities, to assist in the retention of jobs and to assist existing businesses in their growth and development; and to foster and promote tourism development and agricultural stability throughout Tioga County. On January 27, 1989, several persons involved in economic development throughout Tioga County gathered at the Pennsylvania College of Technology/ North Campus for the purpose of discussing ways in which the various areas of the County could work together to promote economic development for Tioga County. The concept of the **Tioga County Economic Development Task Force** was created at the meeting.

As a result, the Tioga County Commissioners created the **Tioga County Economic Development Task Force** and appointed twenty (20) persons from throughout Tioga County to serve on the Task Force. The members brought to the Task Force countless years of experience and knowledge and a commitment to foster and promote the economic development of the County. Realizing the commitment needed, the Task Force began to meet every other Friday. Goals and Objectives were determined, strengths and weaknesses identified, countless meetings were held with numerous people from throughout the County . . . business persons, educators, elected officials, environmentalists and media, resulting in "A Mission Statement for Economic Development in Tioga County."

After thirteen (13) meetings, involving over 285 member hours, the concept of the **Tioga County Economic Development Task Force** was conceived the Task Force completed a Mission Statement. The Mission Statement, endorsed by all of the local economic development corporations and the Tioga County Industrial Development Authority, was formally presented to the Tioga County Commissioners on October 13, 1989 and adopted.

The Task Force evolved into an independent public 501(c)(6) industrial development corporation whose life began on May 22, 1991 as the *Tioga County Development Corporation (TCDC)* was incorporated on May 22, 1991, as a Pennsylvania industrial development corporation. The primary purpose is to foster and promote the overall economic development strategy of Tioga County; to create or assist in the creation of new employment and business opportunities, to assist in the retention of jobs and to assist existing businesses in their growth and development; and to foster and promote tourism development and agricultural stability throughout Tioga County. The Corporation was composed of a twenty one (21) Member Board of Directors of individuals from throughout Tioga County. . . many being the original Task Force Members.

In January, 1991, *TCDC* began to occupy the former Sheriff's residence at 114 Main Street, adjacent to the Tioga County Courthouse. The Tioga County Commissioners and *TCDC* entered into a thirty (30) year lease for the facility. In addition to *TCDC*, the Tioga Visitors Bureau and Wellsboro Chamber of Commerce/GROW had offices in the *TCDC* Building. *TCDC* received a PA Commerce Community Economic Recovery Program (CERP) Grant in 1992 to develop a Economic Strategic Plan for the County. In March 1994, *TCDC* hired its first Executive Director and Secretary through a DCA Circuit Rider Grant and a Legislative Initiative Grant. With a professional staff, *TCDC* was able to implement its Mission first set forth in 1989.

Created to improve the economy of Tioga County and to foster economic development through a centralized countywide effort, the *Tioga County Development Corporation* is responsible for assisting the development of all components of the local economy . . . industrial, commercial, agriculture, and tourism . . . in an effort to maximize limited local resources to their greatest efficiency and effectiveness.

Much change has happened in Tioga County and the Corporation since 1991. Our Board has grown to 31, our staff grew to 5 and is currently at 3. We continue to occupy the *TCDC* Building and the Wellsboro Chamber of Commerce is still a tenant partner.

During the past 20 years the Corporation has been involved in partnering relationships, developing new delivery programs while continuing in our Mission. Some of the many endeavors *TCDC* has been involved in include:

- Development and Administering the **49 CORRIDOR Enterprise Zone** in northern Tioga County resulting securing \$1,245,000 in public grants resulting in the creation of the Tioga County Loan Program
- Development and Administering the **Tioga County Enterprise Zone** currently in operation to foster a business development climate for doing business in Tioga County
- Operations of the Tioga County Loan Program providing low interest loans to Tioga County businesses.
- Development and Operation of **Leadership Tioga County** providing leadership training through the *Youth Leadership Program* and the *Community Leadership Program*.
- Implementation of the **Buy Tioga County** encourage resident to purchase items manufactured, made and grown in Tioga County
- Working in conjunction with the Tioga County Commissioners established the **Tioga County Tax Preferential Abatement Program**
- Through our *Tioga County Foundation* serve as the Education Improvement Organization for the **Education Improvement Tax Credit Program** providing private funds to support public career development and school to work programs in pour public schools
- Through our partnering efforts we have been involved in the Tioga County Partnership for Community Health, development of US Route 15 (future I99), Northern Tier Welcome Center, Mill Cove, Inc., the Deane Center Performing Arts, Tioga County I99 Business Park and many more endeavors

TCDC Submits \$500,000 RACP Grant on behalf of Hydro Recovery, LP

Tioga County Development Corporation continues to support the evolving Natural Gas Industry and support businesses in Tioga County. On January 14, 2011 the *Tioga County Development Corporation* submitted a \$500,000 Reinvestment Assistance Capital Program (RACP) grant on behalf of the hydraulic stimulation fluid manufacturing facilities abatement project being constructed by Hydro Recovery LP in Antrim, PA. The Antrim Plant is slated to be the second plant built in Tioga County. Construction on the first plant began in October 2010 on about 10 acres located in Blossburg, PA and plans to open in April 2011.

The funding was available through the Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program, which is intended to assist in the immediate creation of quality, family-sustaining jobs. Each plant will eventually be staffed by 12-15 employees. Funding from the RACP program will be used towards the construction of a second plant in Antrim, PA, located in Duncan Township, Tioga County. Each Plant is estimated to cost \$12 Million each.

Hydro Recovery LP is a manufacturer of Hydraulic Stimulation Fluid. Hydro Recovery will use a process that will convert flow back water from Natural Gas Drilling fracking operations into a usable Hydraulic Stimulation Fluid. At full capacity, both the Blossburg and Antrim plants are designed to receive approximately 300,000 gallons of high total dissolved solids fluids (HTDSF) per day producing approximately 360,000 gallons of Hydraulic Stimulation Fluid per day.

Osceola Big M Closes on TCDC RLF Loan

Osceola Foods, Inc. (Osceola Big M) closed on a \$35,000 *Tioga County Revolving Loan Fund (TCRLF)* with the *Tioga County Development Corporation* on February 16, 2011. The \$35,000 loan will be used to purchase new Bar Code machinery & equipment and new energy efficiency freezer doors for portable freezer units at its grocery store. The Osceola Big M is located at 7732 Route 49, Osceola, Tioga County, Pennsylvania 16942.

Osceola Foods, Inc., a Pennsylvania Corporation is owned by Mark and Aurel Howe and Krista Cevette. The Howes have owned the full service local grocery store for 13 years. Along with financing from *TCRLF*, Osceola Foods, Inc. received funding from Citizens & Northern Bank.

The general RLF guideline shall limit loan dollars availability to no greater than fifty percent (50%) of the total project costs based on available RLF fund portfolio proceeds, with the funding balance from private loans (bankers and other lenders) and owners contributions (equity). The term of the loan will be up to five (5) years unless otherwise agreed upon by the *Tioga County Revolving Loan Fund* Committee. Loan funds are available to any qualifying for-profit business in Tioga County.

On January 12, 2011 Lisa A Sherman, VMD of Tioga Veterinary Services closed on a \$25,000 *Tioga County Micro Loan Fund* loan with the *Tioga County Development Corporation*. The \$25,000 loan will be used to help purchase new and used machinery & equipment to start a large animal veterinary practice.

Tioga Veterinary Service is a sole practitioner based business. It will offer large animal (cattle, sheep, goats and horses) on-farm veterinary service throughout Tioga and Potter Counties and parts of Steuben County, New York. Dr. Sherman has been a large animal veterinarian since graduating from The School of Veterinary Medicine at University of Pennsylvania in 1998. She is also a graduate of Mansfield University.

In October 2010, the TCDC Board unveiled a new small business loan program, The Tioga County Micro Loan Program. Loans up to \$25,000 may be approved for for-profit business in Tioga County. TCDC Revamps Loan Fees to Benefit Member Applicants

In an effort to provide more benefits to TCDC Members, the Board of Directors on January 14, 2011 established new Loan Application Fees for our low interest loan programs. Effective immediately, the \$300 Loan Application Fee is waived for Members at the Associate Gold (\$250) or high. This is an immediate savings of \$50. "It is a savings to our Members and a benefit to our corporation," explained Chairman David E. Cummings. "Our Board has discussed ways we can provide more benefits to our Members. We believe our loan recipients should be encouraged to become Members, supporting our programs that allow us to assist other businesses."

A business is receiving a major saving with our interest rate at 2 ½ - 3%. A business may decide not to join and would submit the application fee at the time of submission of their loan application. Membership is not a criteria for receiving a TCDC Loan, any for-profit business in Tioga County may apply for our loans. "Our first loan recipient of 2011 recognized the importance of Membership and joined immediately," stated Cummings. There are no TCDC Member benefits for businesses applying for the state loan programs which TCDC is eligible to apply for, including Small Business First, PEDFA, PIDA and MELF. TCDC is a state designed Area Loan Organization (ALO) and a PIDA Certified Provider.

Leadership Tioga County has become the flagship of the *Tioga County Development Corporation* recognized at the state and national level.

Youth Leadership Program (YLP)

From 2000 through April 2010, 327 High School Juniors from the NTSD, STSD and WASD (New Covenant entered in 2009) have graduated from our Program. 1,380 Individuals, Organizations, Government, Businesses and Others have contributed \$790,867.28 in-kind to date.

Community Leadership Program (YLP)

The adult leadership program began in 2002. Through May 2010 106 adults will have graduated representing 35 businesses and organizations. During this time period \$411,299.73 of in kind services from 970 Individuals, Organizations, Government, Businesses and Other.

On Thursday, April 21, 2011, the *Tioga County Development Corporation (TCDC)* Board of Directors will host our 15th Annual *TCDC* Legislative Breakfast. The Legislative Breakfast is designed to inform our Members of how legislation will impact our businesses and communities in Tioga County. This year's topic will be "Tioga County's Housing Crisis: Marcellus Shale." The event will run from 8:00 AM to 10:00 AM at the historic Penn Wells Hotel, 62 Main Street, Wellsboro, Pennsylvania. About a dozen Officials and representatives from McKean County came to Tioga County to learn more about the natural gas industry and how it could potentially impact their region.

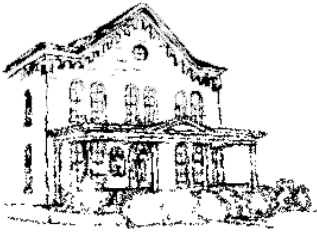
